## TIME TO PAY ORDER

Va. Code 19.2-354, 19.2-354.1, and 19.2-358 grants the Court the authority to establish a payment plan process for individuals owing the court fines and costs. The policy below applies only to cases that are disposed in the Orange Juvenile & Domestic Relations District Court.

Defendants unable to pay the total balance due may request a time to pay agreement. A onetime fee of \$10 will be assessed if the defendant needs more than 90 days to pay in full.

Community service work is an option to allow fines and costs to be discharged. Community service work will not be credited against any amount that is owed for restitution or the interest that has accrued on restitution. Community service must be performed through a non-profit organization.

No Social Security benefit or Supplemental Security income shall be considered an available income in determining the length of time to pay under a deferred, modified deferred, or installment payment agreement and the amount of payments, if any, pursuant to subsection D of 19.2-354.1

The defendant who enters into a time to pay agreement shall notify the clerk's office promptly of any change of address.
